From Our Administrative Pastor...

Be joyful always; pray continually; give thanks in all circumstances, for this is God's will for you in Christ Jesus. 1 Thess. 5:16-18 (NIV)

Dear Brothers and Sisters of Immanuel,

The above Bible verses, 1 Thess. 5:17-18, really wake me up to the importance of giving thanks to God. We're told very plainly and forthrightly that God wants his people to be thankful people (as well as joyful people who pray regularly throughout their lives). Giving thanks to God in all circumstances, Paul says, is "God's will for us in Christ Jesus." Christians may have different gifts and talents, Christians may have different roles and jobs in life, but we're all to be thankful people. It's not an option. God wills it so.

Giving thanks to God, first of all, demonstrates that faith is alive. It demonstrates that the gospel has taken root in the believer's heart and is bearing fruit.

But why? God doesn't need our thanks to exist or find fulfillment. Failing to give thanks to God doesn't diminish his power, glory, or wisdom. Why give thanks?

Giving thanks to God, first of all, demonstrates that faith is alive. It demonstrates that the gospel has taken root in the believer's heart and is bearing fruit. You see, thankfulness to God is the natural (although God given) response of the soul that recognizes the depth of his sin and the glory and magnitude of God's mercy in Christ. Giving thanks is the response of people who, having experienced the hurt of their sin and the sin of others, feel the burden of that sin lifted off their backs by Jesus Christ. (Think about that young man who helped you with some really heavy groceries. Didn't you immediately smile and say, "THANK YOU SO

Thankful people also stay close to Jesus.

MUCH!"?) Giving thanks to God is the response of someone who knows and trusts that Jesus took his place on the cross and grants him eternal life with God in exchange. See the pattern here? God wants you to be thankful because he wants you to know the fullness of Jesus' love and the greatness of his life, death, and resurrection. Thankful people know a good thing when they see it—and Jesus is the greatest good there is.

Thankful people also stay close to Jesus. As thirsting people are thankful for water and stay close to a source of water, and people in the cold are thankful for heat and stay close to a source of heat, so thankful people of God stay close to Jesus. We stay close to Jesus because he's the source of our unending life, health, salvation, meaning, peace and joy.

So, during this year's Thanksgiving Day celebration and every day, "give thanks to the Lord, for he is good, for his steadfast love endures forever." (Psalm 106:1)

Mwadui School Library

This is a tremendous amount in a short amount of time. We didn't quite make our goal of \$25,000 by October, so we will be building the Tanzanian way. Tanzanians build as they have the money with the faith that God will provide the remainder as it is needed. Plans have already been drawn up for the new library, and construction will begin soon!

We drove the 11 hours west, met up with dear missionary friends, stayed for free at the Joy In The Harvest Guest House for missionaries, spent some time swimming in the clean waters of Lake Tanganyika, and took a boat over to Gombe for a day of watching the baboons and chimpanzees. It was magnificent!! A true testament to the beauty of God's creation.

The Start of Our New Life Together

The first days at home in Mwadui have had their challenges, especially with both Michael and Linda fighting terrible colds they picked up at the children's home. For Michael, everything in his world just changed, but we thank God that he seems to be handling it really well. He now sits and eats in his booster seat, sometimes with utensils. He will try new foods, though he is definitely willing to spit out what he doesn't like. He rides in his car seat without feeling panicked. He takes a bath with a playful spirit, rather than screaming. Best of all, we have loved watching his personality emerge. He loves anything that moves (cars, bicycles, motorcycles, etc.), buttons, switches, and levers. He always seems to be observing, learning, and figuring out how things work. He loves organizing everything— crayon boxes, his little cars, his books. We've discovered that he does know some English words and enjoys mimicking us to learn new words. He is still struggling to sleep through the night, but given all that he has been through and the fact that he has a cold, it is to be expected. He has now visited our school and church and a made few trips to Shinyanga to see our social workers. We love him so much and look forward to sharing more of our family's adventures.
