From Our Administrative Pastor...

Dear Brothers and Sisters of Immanuel,

As I look at my calendar this morning, I notice that we're smack dab in the middle of Lent. For the past 3 ½ weeks we've been preparing ourselves for Easter by examining our hearts and reflecting on the price Jesus paid to redeem us. We've also been enjoying a sermon series during our midweek Lenten services called *The Scandal of Lent*. Based on a number of Jesus' sayings and teachings found in the Gospel of John, we've been talking about how these sayings and teachings are difficult for the world to accept. Yet they're very much a part of our lives and faith. Jesus' words aren't scandalous to us at all. No, they're life and salvation.

As I peruse my calendar a bit more, I notice that some special events and services will be celebrated this month. On March 19-20, we'll celebrate Palm Sunday during all our services that weekend. What's more, Immanuel will be presenting the Living Last Supper drama on March 20, at 4 p.m. The drama's a bit different from last year, and our actors have been working hard to make it a memorable and uplifting experience (I'm playing Matthew, the tax-collector). Later that week, Immanuel will have a Maundy Thursday service during which we'll strip the altar as a reminder of the solemnness of the night Jesus was betrayed. The stripping will also prepare us for our observation of Good Friday when we remember Jesus' sacrifice on the cross for our salvation. Then, on Easter Sunday, we'll celebrate our Lord's resurrection with a sunrise service at Camp Wartburg at 6:00 a.m. During our Easter celebrations at Immanuel at 7:45 a.m. and 10:15 a.m. our joy in the Lord will be highlighted by the return of the articles that had been stripped from the chancel on Maundy Thursday.

All in all, a busy month for Immanuel. But it's a good business. It's a business that brings us close to our Savior and affirms our faith in him. As we celebrate Lent and Easter, the wonders of Jesus' love will touch our hearts. More than that, Jesus and his love will transform our lives into lives lived for God and God's people. Have a blessed Lent and a joyous Easter!

A "Note" from our Music Director

There's a theme going on...and it points us to the cross!

Beginning on Ash Wednesday in February, and throughout the month of March, worshippers at Immanuel will have heard various groups sing/ring a familiar Lenten hymn: "When I Survey the Wondrous Cross." However, as one listens to the various arrangements of this hymn, the title remains the same, but the tune changes!

Looking at LSB 425 and LSB 426, one can find the same title on both pages, but the tunes are different: **Hamburg and Rockingham Old.** When singing "When I Survey the Wondrous Cross" which of the tunes is more favored than the other? I am not sure about the answer to that!

Three of Immanuel's music groups are singing/ringing this particular hymn: the Adult Choir, the Agape Ringers, and the Preschool-Second Grade Sunday School Choir.

I pray that when the hymn arrangement is sung/rung (no matter which tune)...the music/words will enlighten and refresh your journey to the cross. Both journeys in fact:

the **one to the cross** with our Lord and Savior hanging on it...

verse 3: See, from His head, His hands, His feet Sorrow and love flow mingled down! Did e'er such love and sorrow meet Or thorns compose so rich a crown!

and, the **one to the empty cross** where our Lord and Savior has conquered sin and death.

verse 4: Were the whole realm of nature mine,
That were a tribute far too small;
Love so amazing, so divine,
Demands my soul, my life, my all!

Health Ministries

In December we mentioned a 6-year-old boy in Kahama named Majid who cannot walk. We helped the church provide the money for him to get to Dar Es Salaam for an evaluation. He, his grandmother, and his social worker traveled there in January and discovered that his condition should be treatable. Praise the Lord! He will have to stay in Dar Es Salaam for one month to be treated with braces and physical therapy, costing \$1,225. We thank God that we were able to pull the money from our general funds. The money was delivered to the family by one of the local pastors in Kahama. Please pray with us that the treatment goes well and that Majid will one day walk.

Baraka and Amani

While in St. Louis last summer, Linda received a crash course from the St. Louis Society for the Blind in teaching Baraka how to use a walking cane. They mentioned that they put together Christmas boxes for kids who are blind. When Amani was also born without eyes, Linda shared the story with them. They were so touched that they sent two Christmas boxes to Tanzania!! As we opened the boxes with the family, we were overwhelmed by their generosity! The boxes were filled with baby toys for Amani, a board so that Baraka can feel what he has written, crayons, markers that he can smell, books with braille and raised pictures, items he can bend and shape, modeling clay and tools, and other manipulatives. We thank God for the wonderful gifts and the hope that this organization brought to a precious family! Baraka is now back at school with his aide and loves all his new educational materials.

Our School

This month we began a new school year, and it looks like we will have more students than ever! Eric began the year teaching freshman math, freshman physics and computers to all grade levels. Thankfully, they have since hired another science and math teacher, so he will now just be teaching computers. In addition, he was asked to be the department head for science and math, so he will be supervising and encouraging teachers in those subjects. Linda is also back in the classroom teaching her once-a-week guidance and counseling class to all the students. Meanwhile, Michael is loving his Friday afternoon playtime with Daddy at school. The library is coming along beautifully.

Self-Care

With so many opportunities right now, it would be very easy to get run down. However, we are striving to be intentional about making time for self-care. We're thankful for the opportunities to heal, grow, and relax, such as listening to sermon podcasts, researching new methods of healing for Linda's digestive system, attending a friend's "Make Your Own Stir Fry" birthday party, and hosting our friends Michael and Ashley Leen from Mwanza for the weekend.

Michael

Our family of three has now been together four months! This next month our social workers will come to our house to write a report on Michael's progress. We are not terribly worried though, because he is an absolute joy! This month he figured out how to get around on his bicycle by himself and started using some full sentences including articles. He is also loving the homeschool curriculum Linda has started with him. Each week is a new theme, so Linda has also enjoyed planning activities for Apple Week, Bear Week, Ball Week, and Building Week. We highly recommend the video of him acting out the song Teddy Bear, Teddy Bear. Since we are getting near the end of the mandatory 6 month foster period, this month we will also meet with our lawyer in Mwanza to set our first court date for the end of March or early April (we hope!). Michael is already ours in our hearts, but we are looking forward to it being official:-)

"Meet & Greet" Luncheon


