Called *Gone Fishin'*, these sermons will focus on God's mighty acts and his saving message delivered to God's people *while they were fishing*. The texts that we'll explore are:

July 16-17 – Luke 5:4-11 July 23-24 – John 21:1-14 July 30-31 – Jonah 1:1-17 August 6-7 – Matt. 17:24-27 The aim of Gone Fishin' is to present God's Word in a creative way and in a way that demonstrates the power and joy of the Gospel of Jesus Christ.

I've never known any pastors or churches to do a series like this, so I'm looking forward to sharing a new and



From Our Associate Pastor...

Grace and peace to all of you in Christ Jesus.

Brothers and sisters, I can't believe that Immanuel and Waterloo are finally a place we can call home. No more, "soon," or "maybe." Instead, we can take joy in saying, "We live in Waterloo." The warm welcome and generosity you all have shown to Veronica and to me has been overwhelming. Despite all of the thank you notes I've been writing at home, and my expression of thanks here, there aren't enough pieces of paper (nor is there enough time) to adequately express how thankful we truly are for all of you.

Paul's words to the church in Philippi rattle around in my mind as I express my thanks to you. "I thank my God in all my remembrance of you, always in every prayer of mine for you all making my prayer with joy, because of your partnership in the gospel from the first day until now. And I am sure of this, that he who began a good work in you will bring it to completion at the day of Jesus Christ." (Phil 1:3-6) Despite all he experienced with persecution and imprisonment, Paul wrote a lot about joy and thankfulness because Paul knew the bigger story rather than the tough time facing him at the moment. The book of Philippians is full of statements about the joy we have in Christ (not to mention that that joy comes from Christ alone...the theme for National Youth Gathering this year). Paul also brings up joy in other books. This past weekend (6/26) the Epistle lesson was from Galatians 5 where Paul says that the fruits of the Spirit are "love, JOY, peace, patience, etc...." Joy and thankfulness are a big deal for us who are in Christ. Even when there is sorrow, sickness, and pain, we are not completely crushed because our joy is not rooted in things of this life alone. Instead we are part of a larger story that has a beautiful ending and for that we give thanks with great joy.

The Psalmist writes:

⁴Sing praises to the Lord, O you his saints, and give thanks to his holy name.
⁵For his anger is but for a moment, and his favor is for a lifetime.
Weeping may tarry for the night, but **joy** comes with the morning.
will come with the morning (Psalm 30).

Our joy doesn't come magically and without any rational. Instead, our joy comes from our sure hope that comes from Christ alone and God's love. God is perfect and just, and His anger at injustice and imperfection is more than we can handle. Yet, the Psalmist tells us God's anger is for a moment, and his favor is for a lifetime. In Christ we saw the extent of

God's love for us. Upon Christ God poured out all of His wrath for the sins that we (yep, YOU and ME) committed and ever will commit. When we go before God thanking Him for giving His own Son for us, and trusting that His words are true—that we're made right before God because of Jesus—we have joy and live a life full of thanksgiving. Sorrow may come in (and stick around through the night) clouding our thoughts, causing us to forget the reason we have such joy, but when Christ returns and we are raised, just as he is raised, joy will never leave.

Thank you so much again! We look forward to working together with all of you as the Holy Spirit advances the kingdom of God in Waterloo and beyond. May the peace of Christ and the joy of eternal salvation be with you all.

Funke News: Many Parts

"Just as a body, though one, has many parts, but all its many parts form one body, so it is with Christ..." "If one part suffers, every part suffers with it; if one part is honored, every part rejoices with it. Now you are the body of Christ, and each one of you is a part of it." 1 Corinthians 12:12, 26-27

Early this month, Michael learned about the parts of the body. We've thought a lot about bodies this month for reasons which will soon become apparent. We are amazed at the interconnectedness of the body, but even more so at the

interconnectedness of the Body of Christ. As 1 Corinthians 12:26 says, "If one part suffers, every part suffers with it; if one part is honored, every part rejoices with it." We have definitely seen this in the body of Christ here and around the world. Thus, we will continue to share our points of suffering and joy with you and would love to hear from you as well. Thank you to each one of you for being part of the body.

That Which Pains Us

Death— Part way through the month, the dogs at our house, our school, and a friend's house received a tainted rabies vaccine. Four out of nine of the dogs passed away including our beloved Maisha. She was our neighbors' dog, but she has been a dear friend of ours since we moved here three years ago. She loved and protected Michael as she would one of her own pups.

Illness— Shortly after Maisha's death, Linda began suffering from what we believed at the time to be a normal reaction to some medication she was taking for SIBO. We later discovered that she actually had a nonrelated infection requiring antibiotics. We thank God that after almost two weeks of fevers and pain, she is recovering.

Disappointment— Only one of the three people we invited to Career Day this month actually showed up. That being said, if only one person was going to exhibit faithfulness and service, at least it was the pastor. The students asked many great questions about the work of the pastor, and we will try to plan another Career Day in the coming months.

Delay— We found out that the judge in our adoption case was called away to Dar Es Salaam to rule on election petitions for the foreseeable future. They gave us a new court date of June 30th, saying that by then either he will be back, or they will have a better idea of when he will be back. Please pray that we can have patience in the wait and that he will return soon.

Causes for Rejoicing

Sex and Relationships Seminar— This month we, along with two other teachers and the school nurse, held our annual sex and relationships seminar, during which we talk about the physical, emotional, and spiritual ramifications of sex. We also cover the topics of abuse and what to look for in a spouse. At the end, we divide the students so that the male teachers can answer any questions the boys have and the female teachers can answer the girls' questions. As usual, the students asked many great questions and expressed gratitude for the seminar. It also opened up the door for counseling with some students individually.

Michael— This month was Linda's first Mother's Day as a mother. We continue to be grateful every day for Michael's laughter, sweet observations, cuddles, and love. All of the documents that the court needs for Michael's adoption case have now been filed. Praise the Lord! All that's left is to wait for our hearing. We were also grateful to spend some time with another adoptive couple and our Dar Es Salaam lawyer, Brooke, when they came to meet with their judge who had been transferred to Shinyanga. Brooke is a fountain of knowledge when it comes to Tanzanian adoption and helped us better understand the upcoming steps.
