175TH ANNIVERSARY. Holy members and all of their Cross is extending an invitation to observe the special milestone of 175 years. There will be two anniversary services on Sunday, July 10, 2016. The congregation's pastor, Rev. Dan A. Ostlund, will preach at the 8:45am Communion service. At 1:00pm former pastor, the Rev. Dr. Karl K Schmidt of Spotsylvania, Virginia, will be the guest preacher. Rev. Schmidt served there in 1966, at the time of the 125th Anniversary. In 1991, he preached at the 150th Anniversary of Holy Cross. There will be fellowship and a meal following the afternoon service. Did you know? Holy Cross is the parent of several existing congregations. Rev. G. A. Schieferdecker, first pastor of Holy Cross (served 1841-1849), organized St. Paul, Columbia, and Holy Cross, Sugarloaf, in 1841; Rev. J. Geo. Birkmann (served 1850-1865) organized Emmanuel at St. Joe in 1853 and in 1869 it relocated & changed to Holy Cross,

Renault; and then Rev. Francis Pieper (served 1900-1910) organized our congregation, Immanuel, Waterloo, in 1901.
