Welcome to Immanuel!

We celebrate Holy Communion today! In this Supper of our Lord we receive the true body and blood of our Lord Jesus Christ under the earthly forms of bread and wine for the forgiveness of our sins and the strengthening of our faith. Since this Holy Communion is also a sign of our common confession of the Christian faith, we welcome to the Lord's Table those who are confirmed members of our Lutheran Church-Missouri Synod. If you have any questions, please feel free to ask the pastor before or after the service.

If for health or personal reasons you cannot drink wine, the lighter colored glasses in the center of the tray of individual cups contain water with a drop of wine. These special glasses allow communicants to celebrate the Lord's Supper according to Christ's institution, but have a very small amount of alcohol.

Worship at Immanuel is...

Multigenerational. We believe that it is a great blessing for family members to worship together. Taking seriously Jesus' words, "Let the little children come to me and so not forbid them" (Mark 10:14), we encourage children to worship with their parents and grandparents and provide resources such as children's bulletins and children's sermons.

Eclectic. Eclectic means, "selecting what seems best of various sources." We believe that we should strive to use the best hymns and practices that the church has to offer. Our worship may include hymns written 500 years ago as well as pieces written 5 months ago.

Trinitarian. We believe that the object of worship is the only true God-The Trinity: Father, Son, and Holy Spirit.

Christ Centered. We believe that at the heart of worship is the Good News that God has rescued us from our sins through Jesus' death on the cross and rising to life again.



Immanuel's Blessed Events of 2017...A Quick Recap

- Ten (10) children were baptized during 2017. Eight boys and two girls.
- Five (5) 8th graders were confirmed on April 30th.
- Nine (9) Agape Ringers participated in the Bell-a-bration Workshop & Concert in February at Peace Lutheran Church in Lemay, MO.
- Nine (9) dedicated people make up the staff of Immanuel Lutheran Church & Preschool (2 pastors, 2 teachers, 1 music director, 1 groundskeeper, 2 custodians, and 1 secretary). And, countless volunteers do various tasks around the church—thank you!
- Our Paraguay Mission Team has been busy throughout 2017 doing fundraisers for their upcoming trip in June 2018. Eighteen (18) Immanuel members will be going on this mission trip. Please keep them in your prayers!
- The annual Mini-Retreat hosted by Immanuel's Women's Christian Ministry was held on April 22nd, and 87 ladies from Immanuel and the area churches attended. The 2018 one is scheduled for April 28th!
- Pastor Demski & Veronica announced that they are expecting a baby girl, Betty Anne, sometime in January 2018. We celebrated with a congregation-wide baby shower on December 10th. Please continue to keep the Demskis in your prayers as the due date is fast approaching!
- Our Vacation Bible School was held at Immanuel in June, and 102 children participated. Holy Cross, Wartburg also co-hosted this fun week at "A Mighty Fortress" in honor of the 500th anniversary of the Reformation.
- Several junior high and high school youth, 3 chaperones, and Pastor Demski took a trip to the Creation Museum and Noah's Ark in July.
- Four (4) people who celebrated their 85th birthdays in 2017 were recognized as "Crown of Silver" recipients in September.
- We hosted a special circuit-wide service on Oct. 29th in honor of the 500th anniversary of the Reformation for all of the churches within our circuit.
 Ann Frank organized the service and the special music. Rev. Wilken was the guest preacher, and a dinner was held following the service. Martin Luther (aka Pastor Lukomski) was on hand during this dinner.
- The work on our narthex expansion project began in April and was completed in October. It is a wonderful addition and blessing to Immanuel. We held a special dedication service on Nov. 12th with several special guests in attendance including the architect, the builder, and Pastor Sievers. Pastor Herbert Mueller, a former pastor of Immanuel, was the guest preacher. Thanks to the Narthex Expansion Committee for all of their hard work! And, thanks to all who have donated to this project!

- During the construction, our pipe organ was covered for a little over 5
 months (April 30-October 10). We enjoyed the piano and keyboard during
 this time, but definitely missed the beautiful sounds of those pipes!
- Due to the increase in space, the Board of Church Properties hired a parttime custodian (Deborah Joellenbeck) to clean the Education Building only. Sandy will clean the church building including the new narthex.
- We honored Cindy Troup (21 years as Preschool Director) and Sandy Mueller (20 years as custodian) in November. Thanks for your service to Immanuel! By the way, Cindy plans to retire at the end of this current school year.
- Forty-five (45) children participated in the Children's Christmas Service
 "To Us a Child Is Born" on Dec. 17th.
- There were 13 funerals and 10 babies born at Immanuel in 2017.
- Immanuel offers a youth bell choir, an adult bell choir, and an adult vocal choir for anyone interested in contributing their instrumental and vocal abilities.
- As of December 22, 2017, we have a roster of 881 baptized members and 716 confirmed members. Our average weekend attendance (for all 3 services) is 224.
