Welcome to Immanuel!

We celebrate Holy Communion today! In this Supper of our Lord we receive the true body and blood of our Lord Jesus Christ under the earthly forms of bread and wine for the forgiveness of our sins and the strengthening of our faith. Since this Holy Communion is also a sign of our common confession of the Christian faith, we welcome to the Lord's Table those who are confirmed members of our Lutheran Church-Missouri Synod. If you have any questions, please feel free to ask the pastor before or after the service.

If for health or personal reasons you cannot drink wine, the lighter colored glasses in the center of the tray of individual cups contain water with a drop of wine. These special glasses allow communicants to celebrate the Lord's Supper according to Christ's institution, but have a very small amount of alcohol.

Worship at Immanuel is...

Christ Centered. We believe that at the heart of worship is the Good News that God has rescued us from our sins through Jesus' death on the cross and rising to life again.

Trinitarian. We believe that the object of worship is the only true God-The Trinity: Father, Son, and Holy Spirit.

Multigenerational. We believe that it is a great blessing for family members to worship together. Taking seriously Jesus' words, "Let the little children come to me and so not forbid them" (Mark 10:14), we encourage children to worship with their parents and grandparents and provide resources such as children's bulletins and children's sermons.

Eclectic. Eclectic means, "selecting what seems best of various sources." We believe that we should strive to use the best hymns and practices that the church has to offer. Our worship may include hymns written 500 years ago as well as pieces written 5 months ago.

In preparation for worship we ask that you silence your cell phones and/or paging devices. Thank you.

CONFESSION AND ABSOLUTION

(Hebrews 9:26)

- P: As we prepare to celebrate our Lord's birth and receive Him as He still comes to us today, let us also remember the reason Jesus was born: "He has appeared once for all at the end of the ages to put away sin by the sacrifice of Himself." He has come to bring peace, yet not always in ways we can see in this world. He has come to bring peace, yet not always in ways we can see in ourselves in our thoughts, words, and actions. He has come to bring peace that is forgiveness of sins and peace with our Father in heaven.
- C: We confess that we have sinned against God and against one another. We yearn for peace with God and reconciliation with one another, yet we cannot accomplish it ourselves. Immanuel's Blessed Events of 2019...A Quick Recap

- Twelve (12) children were baptized. Six girls and six boys.
- Six (6) 8th graders were confirmed on April 28th.
- Nine (9) dedicated people make up the staff of Immanuel Lutheran Church & Preschool (2 pastors, 2 teachers, 1 music director, 1 groundskeeper, 2 custodians, and 1 secretary). And, countless volunteers do various tasks around the church—thank you!
- The annual Mini-Retreat hosted by Immanuel's Women's Christian Ministry was held on April 27th, and 84 ladies from Immanuel and the area churches attended. The 2020 one is scheduled for April 25th, and the theme will be "It Is Well."
- Our Vacation Bible School was held at Immanuel in June, and 91 children participated. Holy Cross, Wartburg co-hosted.
- Three (3) people who celebrated their 85th birthdays in 2019 were recognized as "Crown of Silver" recipients in September.
- Pastor Demski & Pastor Troup switched offices and titles at Immanuel on September 1. Pastor Demski is now our administrative pastor, and Pasotr Troup is now our associate pastor.
- Over fifty children participated in the Children's Christmas Service "What Child Is This" on Dec. 22nd.
- There were 6 funerals and 8 babies born.
